A museum is a building, which is open to the public. It is also the institution where things are collected and then shown to people.

The word, museum, originates from the Muses, which are the goddesses of literature, art, and science who appear in Greek mythology.

According to the International Council of Museums (ICOM), the definition of museums has changed over time.

The oldest museum structure in the world is the Shōsō-in in Nara, Japan.

Today's museums are non-profit, permanent institutions in the service of society and its development.

A museum acquires, conserves, researches, communicates and exhibits the tangible heritage and the intangible heritage of humanity and the environment.

Museums exist for the purposes of education, study and enjoyment.

Some museums have things that visitors can do.

Museums can be about different things such as art, national history, natural history, or science. People go to museums sometimes to learn, or to simply have fun.

Museums with live animals are called zoos.

Exhibitions

- Temporary or changing exhibits
- Exhibition which selects works along with some themes, e.g., a writer, a time, an area, etc.
- Permanent exhibits
- Exhibition which displays the works which the museum possesses.



STEAM ACTIVITY



What do you need?

- 3/4 cup Water
- 2 cups flour
- 1 cup salt
- Dinosaur toys

How do you make them?

- Mix the salt dough ingredients in a bowl, stir and then knead into a ball.
- Separate into small balls for the kids to flatten and then press into them using the plastic toy dinosaurs.



ART ACTIVITY – PAPER PLATE DINO

Required Materials:

- Paper Plates
- Paint
- Paper:
- Googly Eyes

How to do it

1. Start by cutting your paper plate in half.
2. Decide what color body you want your dinosaur to have and paint one of the 1/2 plate pieces. Paint two corresponding clothespins for each dinosaur you want to make.
3. Once your dino body is dry, use it as a template for drawing your dinosaurs spikes, head, and tail. You decided if you want a long neck, short neck, small tail or long tail! This is where the kids can get really creative!
4. Glue your head, tail, and spikes to the back side of the paper plate.
5. Add a little smile and googly eye to your dino head.
6. Attach clothespins and you are done!



ART ACTIVITY – CROWN

Required Materials:

- A paper plate
- Scissors
- School glue or paste

How to do it

Start by cutting the edge off the plate. Discard the inner part, the edge is the part you will be using. Cut a slit in one side of the paper plate so it will better fit your head. Start gluing them onto your paper plate rim starting at one side of the slit and working your way towards the center. Then start at the other side and work towards the center again. Once it's dry, your crown is ready to wear.



Yummy Mummy Bananas!



Ingredients

- 2-3 Bananas
- 2 blocks of White Almond Bark
- Large Ziplock Bag
- Scissor
- Large Glass Bowl and Hot Water

Instructions

Fill your glass bowl with hot water. Not too hot that you cannot touch it.
Put your almond bark inside your ziplock bag, seal, and submerge into the water. After 1-2 minutes your chocolate should be soft enough to manipulate in your hands, squeeze until smooth.
Once the almond bark is completely smooth, work it all into one corner and snip a small hole in the corner with your scissors.
Slice your bananas in half, place them on a plate, and squeeze the melted chocolate over creating your mummy design.
While chocolate is still warm place in your candy eyes.
Wait until chocolate firms and then eat!



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
