Rainbow salad


Nutrition: Per serving


Ingredients:

350 gr pasta
200 gr green beans, chopped into short lengths 160 gr can tuna in olive oil


4 tablespoon mayonnaise
4 tablespoon natural yogurt
$1 / 2$ small pack chives
200 gr cherry tomatoes
1 orange pepper, cut into little cubes

Cook the pasta ( 2 minutes less than the pack instructions) and drain well. Cook the green beans in hot water for 2 minutes, then rinse in cold water and drain well. Mix the tuna with the mayonnaise and yogurt. Add the chives, if using

Tip the pasta into a large glass bowl.

Add the tuna dressing over the top of the pasta. Add a layer of green beans, followed by a layer of cherry tomatoes, then the pepper and sweetcorn. Cover and chill until you're ready to eat.

Now, it is time to having: Math in Bath :D
It is so funny, let's get started


You see, bubbles are so cute...
But do you know how can you make bubbles yourself ?!
Wow! it is so amazing, let's learn together.


What You'll Need

- 10 cups of water
- 1 cup dish soap
- 1 teaspoon of glycerin (optional; found at pharmacies)
- A wide, flat pan
- Chenille sticks
- Plastic drinking straws

What You'll Do

- Mix the water, soap, and glycerin together in the pan.
. To make bubble wands, shape large and small circles from chenille sticks, and twist on a handle. The straws can be used to make little bubbles.
- Dip the wands in the soapy mix, then blow!

To Play
(There's a lot to notice, do, and discover when it comes to bubbles. Here are some ideas) :

- Test different ways of blowing on the soap film—gently or forcefully, fast or slow.
- See how the bubbles pick up the colors around them.
- Notice the shadows made by bubbles. Look at the colors in the shadows.
- Try attaching a number of bubbles together on one wand.
- Pass a bubble back and forth between teammates.
- Experiment with making a very big bubble.
- Use a straw to make very tiny bubbles.
- Observe what happens when a bubble pops.
- See how the wind affects where the bubbles go.
- Compare what happens to big bubbles and small bubbles in the wind.
- Discover which surfaces bubbles will attach to without popping, and notice how the bubbles look when they attach.

Now, would you please tell me which of these
bedrooms are dark? And why?


Do you want to make a Chinese paper lantern for the time your bedroom is dark, and make your bedroom beautiful?!



Here's what you need:
.Paper or cardstock (preferably red or yellow)
.Scissors
.Stapler or tape
.Glue
.Ruler
.Pencil
.Things to decorate your lantern with: gift wrap paper, washi tape, ribbons, sequins, stickers, glitter glue, small buttons, etc.


Prepare the paper.
Start out with an A4, Letter size, or any rectangular sheet of paper or cardstock. Red and yellow are preferred colors for a Chinese-themed lantern but you can always choose any color you like

Make the handle.
Cut a 2.5 cm wide strip off on one short side. Set this aside for the handle.

Fold the paper in half.
Fold the paper in half, lengthwise.

Draw a horizontal line.
Draw a horizontal line one inch from the long edge opposite the fold.

This line is just a guide for cutting and may not be necessary for more mature crafters.

Cut the first slit. Starting from the folded edge, cut a straight line about an inch from one short edge, all the way up to the horizontal line

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## Cut more slits.

Continue to cut more straight lines about 2.5 cm apart until you reach the opposite short edge of the paper.

Remember that the horizontal line marks the point where you stop cutting each straight line.

## Unfold the paper.

Unfold the paper. The paper will have several vertical slits along the middle. Erase any pencil marks or re-fold the crease the opposite way to hide the pencil marks at the back.

Decorate the top and bottom edge.
You can keep your lantern plain or decorate the top and bottom edges. Here are some ideas you can try:
a.) Paint or color - make a border by painting or coloring the top and bottom edge of the paper.
b.) Draw details - create patterns and details with glitter glue, puffy paint, or colored markers.
c.) Glue a band - glue a strip of gift wrap paper, patterned paper, washi tape, fabric, lace or a wide ribbon to make a border.
d.) Glue shapes or notions - glue craft foam or felt shapes, small buttons, beads, sequins and other notions.

Remember to leave at least $1 / 2$-inch of undecorated area on one top corner. This gap will allow you to connect the two edges of the paper to form a lantern.

## Form the paper into a lantern.

Transform the paper into a lantern by forming it into a tube shape. Overlap the long edges at least 1.5 cm . Staple or tape at the top and bottom of the overlap

Glue the handle.
Take the paper handle you made in Step 2. Glue the ends on the inside of the lantern's top edge. Decorate the handle if you like.

Once the glue dries, you can hang use it.



Now let's close our eyes and think about the good things, the beautiful day we spent together, and the new things we learned together.
I'll make a house for you so you can decorate it as you like.

But if you still can't sleep, you can count these sheep and tell me how many sheep look to the right and how many sheep look to the left!


The pattern for your home, please cut them.


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Now attach them together with glue.
